Firstly, explore if they are already connected with a settlement agency. You can say "**do you have a settlement worker** or settlement counsellor?". If so, you should ask for consent to reach out to their worker to arrange follow up.

There are several settlement agencies in Edmonton that you can connect a patient with. Many of them offer overlapping services and they will work to refer clients between agencies when needed. Generally a good start is **finding a settlement agency that is close to the patient's home.**
